



The AIWOS 2021 Philatelic Jury Report

The Jury of AIWOS 2021 – Philately, composed by Giancarlo Morolli (president), Luciano Calenda, Jari Majander, José-Ramon Moreno, and Peter Suhadolc, is pleased to present its report.

The jury congratulates the AICO for having launched this initiative and hopes that it will trigger a more intense program of Olympic and Sport events, after the glorious past in this field, as well a closer interaction and cooperation among the leading exhibitors for further spreading the appeal of this very special area of philately.

The great success of entries has made the work of the jury very demanding, because of both the time required and the variety of subjects treated. Furthermore, being one of the very first virtual exhibitions with a large international participation, i.e., 13 countries represented, some jury activities have been necessarily a learning by doing process.

The jury evaluated the exhibits in depth and granted the awards according to the regulations of the International Federation of Philately (FIP). Some entries were transferred to a different class, as the jury found it more appropriate for the benefit of the exhibitor. This concerns, in particular, some exhibits matching the definition of Modern Philately, a recently introduced FIP class focused on items produced in the last decades. Furthermore, entries up to 36 pages were judged according to the guidelines for One Frame Exhibits.

Due to the special circumstances and the quality of several scans, it was impossible to assess the appropriateness of some items shown, namely proofs and rare pieces. However, all exhibitors are recommended to have any doubtful item expertized, for their own interest.

Since the number of participating exhibits exceeds by far that planned, the individual talks with exhibitors will be replaced by a Zoom seminar aimed at presenting suggestions on how to improve the exhibits.

CITIUS, ALTIUS, FORTIUS **OLYMPIC GAMES PARIS 1924**



1. THE OLYMPIC GAMES IN HISTORY

It all originated in Greece, in the city of Olympia. A simple stadium race became an institution that interrupted wars and brought the peoples of the world together, sometimes only for a few days.

2. FRANCE CALLS THE SPORTSMEN OF THE WORLD

With the renewed application, Paris, the capital of France, wanted to make up for the disgrace of 1900. After the war, the aim was to offer the world sporting competitions again.

3. THE PREPARATIONS ARE UNDERWAY

A stadium and an Olympic Village must be built for the Olympics. Only after the medals at a winter sports week in Chamonix and at the art competitions will the athletes arrive in Paris.

4. THE SPORTS FESTIVAL CAN BEGIN

The opening in Paris is celebrated as a big party, the protocol sets the course. Presidents Coubertin and Doumergue welcome many heads of state. There are many changes in the sports program.

5. FAIR PLAY IN THE COMPETITION

Rules determine the course of the sports, these must be observed by the athletes. In the competition also the competitors should be treated fairly.

6. PARIS IN THE CENTER OF THE SPORTS WORLD

The Olympic sports program was broadly diversified. Rugby said goodbye, sailing was performed at the port of Le Havre and in swimming there was a great hero.

7. WITH THE WREATH OF LEAVES ON THE HEAD

To become an Olympic champion is a dream of many, but to come home with the wreath of leaves was not possible for everyone. The baton was passed on to Amsterdam after the games were over.



The AIWOS Memorabilia Jury Report

The jury - composed by Christophe Ait-Braham, Mario Capuano, and Pete Wade - appreciated these 17 beautiful exhibits and presentations which showed all the diversity and richness of Olympic memorabilia.

Each of these presentations shows a particularity: a light on an Olympiad, on a sport, on a particular collection, on Olympians.

The Jury particularly appreciated the exhibitors who made a particular effort to provide visitors with knowledge through its presentation and explanations. Some exhibitors have done a real job of research and thus contribute to a better knowledge of Olympic history and culture.

It is a beautiful illustration of the Olympic philosophy which makes the link between sport and culture.

Some exhibitors have accompanied the objects of their exhibits with accurate descriptions and captions, others have told us the story of their memorabilia within an Olympic or sporting event. This is the method the jury prefers to be used in the future, rather than trying to show the list of the items they have collected. The jury believes that this suggestion could help the exhibitors to highlight their collection for the next edition and for the pleasure of visitors and enthusiasts!

This exhibition was a first for memorabilia collectors with a jury. We have learned a lot from this enriching experience that will serve us in future editions. It was an important step in the promotion of the Olympic memorabilia collections accessible to the general public. Many thanks to all participants!
