

Since 1894, Paris, intimately linked to the history of the international Olympic movement, is in a way the eldest daughter of Olympism.


For four days, we will share with you our Olympic history but also our Olympic fraternity.

Exhibition

Under the high patronage of Khunying Patama Leeswadtrakul, member of the International Olympic Committee, President of the IOC Culture and Heritage Commission.

Eleven private collectors, two sports and cultural institutions an international delegation from China will do us the honor of sharing their Olympic history, their legacy of the Games!

Hundreds of objects, documents, sometimes rare, but always impressive or moving will be presented: rare books, torches, pins, bibs, banknotes, stamps, postcards, medals, mascots, videos, drawings, unpublished photos ...

14 points of view from 14 participants on this legacy left to us by the Olympic Games of the modern era since 1896.

Each object tells a story and will transport you into the world of Olympic culture.



The stages of construction and the renewal of the modern Olympic Games through the visionary writings of Baron Pierre de Coubertin [Richard ROUSSEL]

Through a series of works, the history of the renovation of the Olympic Games is built little by little under the impetus of Baron Pierre de Coubertin, but also of his friend Father Didon, whose work and involvement in the success of the renovation of the Games is often overlooked and brought back to light today.

The participants medals in the Games organized in France from 1900 to 1992

France has had the honor of hosting four editions of the Olympic Games: two in summer (Paris 1900, Paris 1924) and two in winter (Grenoble 1968, Albertville 1992). Medals remind us of the very strong links between France and Olympism.

Olympic Torches from 1936 to the present day

Since the Olympic Games in Berlin in 1936, each celebration of the Olympic Games has given rise to the creation of torches to carry the flame from Olympia to the host country. After that, the Olympic flame will be in you!

Rugby at the Olympic and Paralympic Games

Rugby union was on the program of the Olympic Games in 1900, 1908, 1920 and 1924. Wheelchair rugby became a Paralympic discipline in 1996, as a demonstration sport and from 2000 as an official sport. Rugby 7 was admitted to the Olympic Games from the Rio 2016 Games. The whole story is presented to you.

Olympic culture in China through pins

representing the colors and the corresponding Olympic Games logo. We will also appreciate the evolution of the design over time. The bibs bear witness to the commitment, passion and perseverance of the athletes.

The intimacy of the 1924 Paris Games in a photo album

In 1924, the French Olympic Committee had set up a photographic service in charge of taking pictures of the Paris 1924 Olympic Games and hired a team of around twenty photographers for this purpose. Their shots were offered to press agencies and newspapers, which chose them by leafing through the pages of a large grimoire on which the photos captioned in the print run were pasted and numbered. In the early 2000s, the rediscovery of boxes from the move of the CNOSF headquarters in 1922 revealed this album, among other identical ones, and its nearly 2,500 mostly unpublished photos. Saved digitally and physically, these pieces of national sports heritage reveal the atmosphere in Paris, behind the scenes of the daily lives of athletes, details of the sites. These plates are exhibited for the first time on the occasion of the 27th World Olympic Collectors' Fair.

Olympic mascots: the face of the Games and their emblematic objects

The mascots, coveted by young and old alike, have been the face of the Olympic Games since 1972, with Waldi in Munich for the summer... and retroactively with Schuss for the winter, in Grenoble in 1968. These mascots, with some unique editions are presented with some

are the artistic expression
of the host country which
invites us to share its
culture.

Pictograms: the art of the symbolic representation of sports

Long before writing, human beings were keen to maintain their memory and transmit their knowledge through drawing. Whether painted or engraved, the symbolism of the drawings becomes a form of universal communication.

The Olympic and Paralympic movements have faced many challenges over their long existence. Among these is the need to welcome, bring together and manage thousands of athletes, organizers and spectators, despite the many language barriers. Another more modern challenge is to produce an easily recognizable visual identity that allows each edition to stand out from its predecessors while respecting the same codes. This is how the Olympic pictograms were born.


